First Reading: Exodus 34: 4-6, 8-9

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had commanded him. And the Lord descended in the form of a cloud, and Moses stood with him there. He called on the name of the Lord. 


Parishioners are welcomed back to Mass with the State Government announcing Phase 3 of the Covid-19 Roadmap! The following directives come into place from 6th June:

- Churches are permitted to open with capacity limit of 100 people.
- Social distancing to be maintained by keeping 1.5metres from other persons of other households.
- Name and contact details of every person who enters the Church for any reason is recorded and these records must be retained.
- Anyone who is feeling unwell is not permitted to enter the Church.
- Holy water fonts are to remain empty. Hymn books are not to be used.
- Parish bulletins should not be re-used and may be taken home or disposed of.
- Hand sanitizers to be available at each entrance to the Church.

The opening sentence of today's gospel touches something very deep in human experience. Jesus tells his disciples: "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now." In John's gospel, Jesus is depicted as sensitive to the anguish of his friends and to their limited capacity to absorb the enormity of what was happening to him and to them. There was only so much they could "bear" as the inevitability of Jesus' death dawned on them.

The Trinity is one of the most fascinating - and controversial - Christian teachings. The Trinity is described as a "mystery." By mystery the Church does not mean a riddle, but rather the Trinity is a reality above our human comprehension that we may begin to grasp, but ultimately must know through worship, symbol, and faith. It has been said that mystery is not a wall to run up against, but an ocean in which to swim.

Let us continue to pray for the sick members of our families and also within our Parish especially: Nancy Laurino, and in a special way Laline Ford and David McGuire. Please keep them in your prayers.
