14th JUNE 2020 - THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST YEAR A

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

'Do not become proud of heart. Do not forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that

The word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm: *Praise the Lord Jerusalem!*

Second Reading: First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 10:16-17

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that,

though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf. **The word of the Lord.**

SEQUENCE: (Short form) Behold the bread of angels, sent for pilgrims in their banishment,
The bread for God's true children meant that may not unto dogs be given:
Oft in the olden types foreshowed; In Isaac on the altar bowed,
And in the ancient paschal food, and in the manna sent from heaven.
Come then, good shepherd, bread divine, still show to us thy mercy sign;
Oh, feed us still, still keep us thine; so may we see thy glories shine
In fields of immortality; O thou, the wisest, mightiest, best,
Our present food, our future rest, Come, make us each thy chosen guest,
Co-heirs of thine, and comrades blest, with saints whose dwelling is with thee.
Amen. Alleluia.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live for ever. **Alleluia!**

Gospel: John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the crowd: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me, and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

Parishioners are welcomed back to Mass with the State Government announcing Phase 3 of the Covid-19 Roadmap! The following directives come into place from 6th June:

Churches are permitted to open with capacity limit of 100 people.
