

This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. Annual Diocesan Appeal: Peter's Pence Collection


Thank you to everyone who donated to the Peter's Pence Appeal—a total of \$52.00 was raised.
