23rd October 2022 - THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

First Reading: Book of Ecclesiasticus 35:12-14,16-19

The Lord is a judge who is no respecter of personages. He shows no respect of personages to the detriment of a poor man, he listens to the plea of the injured party. He does not ignore the orphan's supplication, nor the widow's as she pours out her story. The man who with his whole heart serves God will be accepted, his petitions will carry to the clouds. The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds, until it arrives he is inconsolable, And the Lord will not be slow, nor will he be dilatory on their behalf. **The word of the Lord.**

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord hears the cry of the poor.

Second Reading: Second Letter of St Paul to Timothy 4:6-8,16-18

My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing. The first time I had to present my defence, there was not a single witness to support me. Every one of them deserted me – may they not be held accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's

mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen. **The Word of the Lord**

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! God was in Christ, to reconcile the world to himself; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us. **Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 18:9-14

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else: 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

October is the month traditionally devoted to the Holy Mother of God, as the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th. All are invited to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary by devotion to the Holy Rosary. Today we join with St Bernard's Parish Kojonup in their 66th annual celebration of Rosary Rally.



In 1953 a Rosary Rally Crusade was held in the grounds of St Bernard's Convent School led by Redemptorist Father Fergusson of North Perth with 8 priests from around the district and 700 attendees. The object of the rally was to promote the recitation of the Rosary as a daily observance by Catholic families in their homes. In 1955 George and Mary

Jeffs purchased a beautiful marble statue of Mary Immaculate and mounted it on a rock on their farm at Jingalup. They initiated the Rosary Rally, which has been held on the last Sunday of October every year since. The statue now resides at the school, since the Jeff's farm has been sold.

Let us continue to pray for the sick members of our families and also within our Parish especially: Julian Letter, Laline Ford and David McGuire; Please keep them in your prayers.
