SUNDAY 11th JUNE 2023 - THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI) YEAR A

First Reading: Book of Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14-16

Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord. 'Do not become proud of heart. Do not forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known. Responsorial Psalm: Praise the Lord, Jerusalem.

Second Reading: Second Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 10: 16-17

Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.' **The Gospel of the Lord**


Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrating the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.
