**Gospel: Mark 10:17-30**

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, ‘Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?’ Jesus said to him, ‘Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.’ And he said to him, ‘Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.’ Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, ‘There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.’ But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, ‘How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!’ The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, ‘My children,’ he said to them ‘how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.’ They were more astonished than ever. ‘In that case’ they said to one another ‘who can be saved?’ Jesus gazed at them. ‘For men’ he said ‘it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.’ Peter took this up. ‘What about us?’ he asked him. ‘We have left everything and followed you.’ Jesus said, ‘I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.’ **The Gospel of the Lord**

**Next Week’s Readings: Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B 20th October 2024:**

Isaiah 53:10-11; Letter to the Hebrews 4:14-16; Mark 10:35-45

Today’s readings challenge us to take stock of our lives, from our material possessions to our independence. What are we unduly attached to? In a practical sense, what’s getting in the way of our love of God and our love of our neighbour (and neighbour today includes all creation)? What will we do with our time, our talent and our treasure today? Merely asking Jesus what we must do to obtain eternal life won’t work!

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, and is a good time to commit to praying the Rosary. The Rosary will bring great peace and holiness to your life and is the best method of honouring Mary. And for those of you who already in this beautiful habit, it is the perfect month for you to share this devotion with others.



During World Mission Month, we are called to “Invite others to the banquet”, and we invite you to share the warmth of God’s love with our brothers and sisters who need it most. In Mongolia, vulnerable people requiring social services often face stigma for using them. Those in need are often impacted by domestic violence or homelessness.
